HOLI FESTIVAL





Holi is a Hindu spring festival. The festival is celebrated on two days. The First day is the full moon night. It is the starting of the spring season. People celebrate with a huge bonfire. The next day, people play with colors. It is called Spring Festival or Color Festival, or simply Holi.

WHEN IS HOLI CELEBRATED?





It lasts for a night and a day, starting on the evening of the Full Moon day. In 2018 the festival is on March 1st. However, the exact date of Holi is decided by the Hindu Calendar.

Holi is an important festival across the whole of India. In Northern India, Holi is more vivid, especially in Delhi, Jaipur, Agra.



THE ORIGIN OF BONFIRE
