Reading

Reading class is a very important aspect of a child's language and learning development, especially here at Marshall, and I'm glad to say that we have created very good independent readers during this year. Through the concept of reading aloud and comprehending the text, the students are able to grasp phonics and pronounce the words clearly and correctly. They also get the experience of obtaining new vocabulary words, which in turn, will increase their conversational skills. I especially like the idea that all of the children go to the library and pick a book to read at home once a week, which is of their choosing, as this encourages them to want to read. Math:

MPM books and materials are used as an interesting and effective way for the students to learn common mathematical concepts. Colors, animals and objects are used, as a way to make math learning fun and interesting for the children, to include associated educational games.

We are using the Sadlier Phonics B book for this class, which is a very useful and colorful book to help the students practice their phonics sounds. The students already do a great job with sounding out small and medium sized words, and this book will allow them to be more advanced phonetically. We will continue reviewing the old material along with this new material, to always

ensure the students will consistently remember their sounds.

閱讀

Math:
