Dear Parents,

The month of March is going to be a wonderful time lined up with many fun activities and learning initiatives. The school curriculum is sure to dazzle and impress. The reading classes are wide and diverse. The set of reading stories are as follows: *All About Light, Food Court, The Mural,* and *An unusual Show*. The story settings are full of details regarding each topic. The song and movement class will host two songs: *Somewhere Out There* and *Forever Young*. These two delightful songs are classics. One is a sentimental song going back down memory lane and the other about being ready for the challenges of life and remaining full of vigor and energy indefinitely. The core material classes will span the section covering Unit three (3) Week (3) Workshop being a fun and fascinating story with numerous events unfolding within.

The month of March will have Deer students continue moving ahead with their intended academic goals inching their way toward graduation. I want to continue to maintain their momentum to attain the year-end targets. The subjects are songs and movement, core material, grammar (Jump2), math (MPM), phonics, reading and writing. All of the subjects are equally important in their own way. We follow the intended instructions with some examples then the Deer students complete the required in-class work. I believe that as the semester progresses, the work may become a bit more in-depth and demanding. Nevertheless, I do have full confidence that each individual student will do all the work to his or her best ability.

Reading Class

Their reading ability and group intiative are both strong and robust. I am pleased with their progress. This semester will witness the introduction of harder reading books. The line up of the stories will be easy then hard, alternating, so as to have the students make progress yet not get overwhelmed and discouraged. It is a tried and tested method at this school. It works well. Most of the students are starting to get into the habit of using their fingers to point at the words and know their location. It

helps ensure cohesion and focus as they read line by line. Reading races, find the page or describe the picture(s) are different activities to boost memory retention and current interest in the given reading story. Furthermore, the more challenging books will not be sent home on Fridays, but on the following Tuesdays. It will take not five days but seven for these books to be fully comprehended. It is our wish that once the books are brought home, the parents will encourage their child to read to them or read together. Phonics Class

In phonics class, the Deer students will be delving further in the long vowels involving double consonant beginnings and endings: sh, ck, and silent combinations: kn and wr. Further sentence making and fill-in-the-blanks will remain. The students' strengths continually increase so I have full confidence they can handle anything that is dealt to them. 親愛的家長您好:
