Reading

Reading class is something we take a lot of pride in here at Marshall. We aim to have a class of independent readers with a full grasp of phonics and the pronunciation of words. This class is

also great for building up their vocabulary which in turn benefits their conversation skills. I find this class feeds the student's imagination, inspires children to read stories in their own time. As reading is a personal favourite pass time for me I take a lot of care bringing out the best possible results for the children in this subject and I hope you will all see a steady improvement in your child's ability.

11/30-12/4: The Frog in the Pond

Core Material

This class is an all encompassing lesson for the children's reading, grammar and phonics skills. In these classes children are asked to analyse stories, practice vowel sounds and use a selection of keywords for sentence making and grammar. This year we have started to assess the students on their spelling and understanding of concepts. This is a non-pressurised situation where we review the core material and assess it through 'fill the gap' or 'choose the correct word' exercises. I am trying to encourage them to do it by themselves and not shout out the answers so everyone gets the opportunity to complete it independently. We then review and test the spelling of the keys words.

11/30-12/4: Unit 2 Week 3 Anthology. "A Community in Nature". This unit focuses on a story called "At a Pond" which talks about the different kinds of animals that live in ponds such as frogs, turtles and fish.

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12/21-12/25: Unit 2 Week 4 Workshop. "Let's help". This unit focuses on how people help out in the community. What can they do to make changes and to make a difference. They can help build and look after a community garden, organise tidying up the neighbour or helping the older or vulnerable people.

Conversation- Workbook Jump 2

Conversation is an integral aspects of life at Marshall. We teach this formally in class but also at every moment when the English Teacher is present. We try to encourage speaking English from the moment they start and all through lunchtime, playtime and as they go about their daily lives. The conversation starts with simple questions such as what's your name and develops as their English develops. I love talking with the children and watching their skills grow and seeing their personalities shine threw.

11/30-12/4: P34-35. Time expressions such as in the morning/afternoon/evening and making sentences such as, "I wash my hair in the morning."

12/7-12/11: P36-37. Affirmative and negative sentences for time expressions such as, "He watches T.V. in the evening" or, "He doesn't watch T.V. in the morning."

12/14-12/18: P38-39. Using apostrophes to show contractions e.g. do not=don't, is not=isn't.

12/21-12/25: P40-41. Review Spelling and Grammar

12/28-12-31: P42-43. Animals vocabulary such as snake, bear and parrot. Do you/they like..? Yes, I/they do. No, I/they don't.

Phonics

This semester we will increase our focus on phonics to aid their reading development to add to their pre-existing knowledge and of sightwords. This is the basis of reading so is very important as their vocabulary increases and difficulty level advances. We use a combination of workbook exercises and whiteboard activities and combine it with spelling.

11/30-12/4: P71, 72, 77. Assessment long vowels and 'l' blends. Introducing 'hard' and 'soft' -c.

12/7-12/11: P79-81. Introducing 'hard' and 'soft' -g.

12/14-12/18: P82-85. Assessment 'hard' and 'soft' -c and -g. Initial l blends such as 'gl, sl, cl, bl, fl and pl'. Initial r blends such 'br, cr, dr, fr, gr, pr, and tr.' Initial s blends such as 'st, sw, sp and sk.'

12/21-12/25: P86-88. Reviewing initial blends. Final blends such as 'st, mp, lt, ft and ld.'

12/28-12-31: P90, 91, 93. Review blends and Spelling and Writing.

Math

We are using the MPM books and boxes for our maths class. They really have a unique and interesting way of delivering common mathematical concepts to the children often by using

animals, colours and objects that children associate with fun and games! This month we will focus on...

11/30-12/4: E4:P1-5 Addition- counting and writing numbers.

12/7-12/11: E4:P6-10 Measurements- counting and identifying most and least.

12/14-12/18: E4:P11-14 Coordinates to identify different locations.

12/21-12/25: E4:P15-18 Coordinates to identify different locations.

12/28-12-31: E5:P01-5 Subtraction- counting and writing numbers.

Writing

The year continues the successful innovative approach of the last two years. The book has a four-level writing course which takes young learners from beginner to low-intermediate level and builds a solid foundation for more advanced writing capacity.

11/30-12/4: P34-35 Unit 4 Superstar Suzy Soo. Talking about things we like or he likes.

12/7-12/11: P36-37 Unit 4 Superstar Suzy Soo. Present simple tense and plural nouns.

12/14-12/18: P38-39 Unit 5 My Day. Writing about daily routines. For examples, "I go to school at 7 o'clock."

12/21-12/25: P40-41 Unit 5 My Day. Verbs that end in s, sh, or ch, add -es. Verbs that end in y, delete y and add -ies.

12/28-12-31: P42-43 Unit 5 My Day. Putting things in the correct order based on time.

Physical Education

This is important for all everyone. In our busy lives we all often forget to exercise and I am a strong believer in "Healthy Body/Healthy Mind" so is vital for our younger generation to get lots of exercise and fresh air. Not only does it benefit our bodies but also our social skills such as teamwork, competition and fair play. I have started to include team activities to promote teamwork, encouragement and understanding consequences if you don't try hard for your team. Gross motor skills can aid with our fine motor skills too so I try to include activities such as relay races, follow the leader and co-ordination tasks which are fun and engaging.

Song and Dance

This is a great opportunity for myself and the students to bond and enjoy some songs together. Singing and dancing not only teaches new words and tunes but also aids listening and Gross/Fine Motor skills as dancing involves learning movements so requires good co-ordination. These songs and dances are often included in our Drama Plays so are an important aspect of Marshall school life.

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Thematic Activity

Each month a different foreign teacher is assigned to plan and arrange activities of a given theme. This can be anything from small art projects, short field trips near the school or even a party in the classroom! The themes are often related to different festivals around the world so it really helps them to understand different cultures while having fun at the same time.

December's activities will revolve around thematic activities where we learn about culture, history and food etc. These are always fun and exciting for the children.

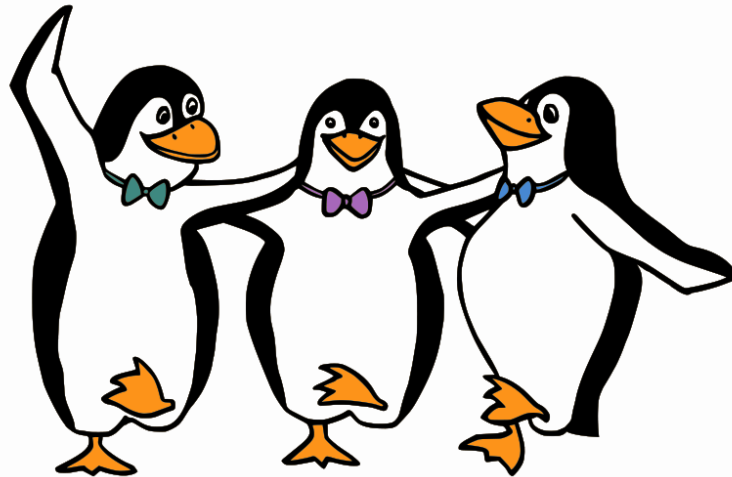
Library/Storybook

閱讀

閱讀課是我們瑪歇爾引以為傲的課程。我們的目標是讓孩子能夠獨立閱讀，並且正確念出單字的發音及語調。孩子們正快速累積他們的單字詞彙量，這對孩子們的對話技巧是有很大的幫助。

我發現這個課程能夠激發孩子們的想像力，激發他們利用時間閱讀故事。由於閱讀對我個人而言是最喜歡的一件事情，我花很多心思地為思考如何讓孩子們的能力提升，我希望你們會看到孩子的能力在逐漸進步。

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主教材

此課程主要是圍繞著孩子的閱讀、語法和發音技能。在課程中，會讓孩子分析故事，練習發音，並使用關鍵字造句和語法使用。今年，我們開始評估學生的拼寫和對概念的理解。這是一種沒有壓力情況，我們通過“填補空白”或“選擇正確的單詞”練習來讓孩子學習。我鼓勵孩子們自己做，而不是大聲說出答案，這樣每個人都有機會獨立完成它。之後我們便複習並測試拼出這些關鍵字

11/30-12/4: Unit 2 Week 3 Anthology. “A Community in Nature”. 這單元著重在一個故事叫做 “At a Pond”，故事內容是關於不同種類的動物住在池塘，像是青蛙、烏龜和魚。

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12/21-12/25: Unit 2 Week 4 Workshop. “Let’s help”. 這單元著重在人們如何幫助社區，我們可以怎麼做讓它不一樣，他們可以幫助建立和照顧社區的花園，也可以幫助鄰居、老年人或弱勢群體。

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會話 Jump 2 Grammar and Spelling

我們的對話課程有稍微做點改變，包括我們正在教授的語法與相關拼寫。會話是瑪歇爾生活中不可或缺的一部分。我們用此方式教學，當然在英文老師在場時也全然是英語的。我們鼓勵孩子們說英語，即使是午餐時、遊戲時間或是生活中的一切。彼此的對話從簡單的問題開始，例如：你的名字去啟發孩子們說英語。我喜歡和孩子們交談，看著他們的會話技巧一次比一次進步，及每個孩子不同的人格特質。

寫作課

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主題活動

每個月都會由一名外籍教師來規劃和安排特定主題的活動。這可以是小型藝術項目，不僅是戶外教學，甚至是教室裡的派對！這些主題通常與世界各地的不同節日有關，因此它確實有助於孩子們從事有趣活動中，同時理解不同的文化、歷史與食物等，孩子們對於活動總是興奮且有趣的。

圖書室故事時間

每週孩子們都有機會借一本書回家自己閱讀，最近我選了一些好玩有趣的故事書在課堂裡讀給他們聽，我花了些時間從故事書中解釋道德的概念，很高興看到他們都聽故事並引起興趣！他們真的參與了這些故事，我相信這對他們的傾聽和想像力都有好處！

希望這封信對所有人而言是具有洞察力的信。
