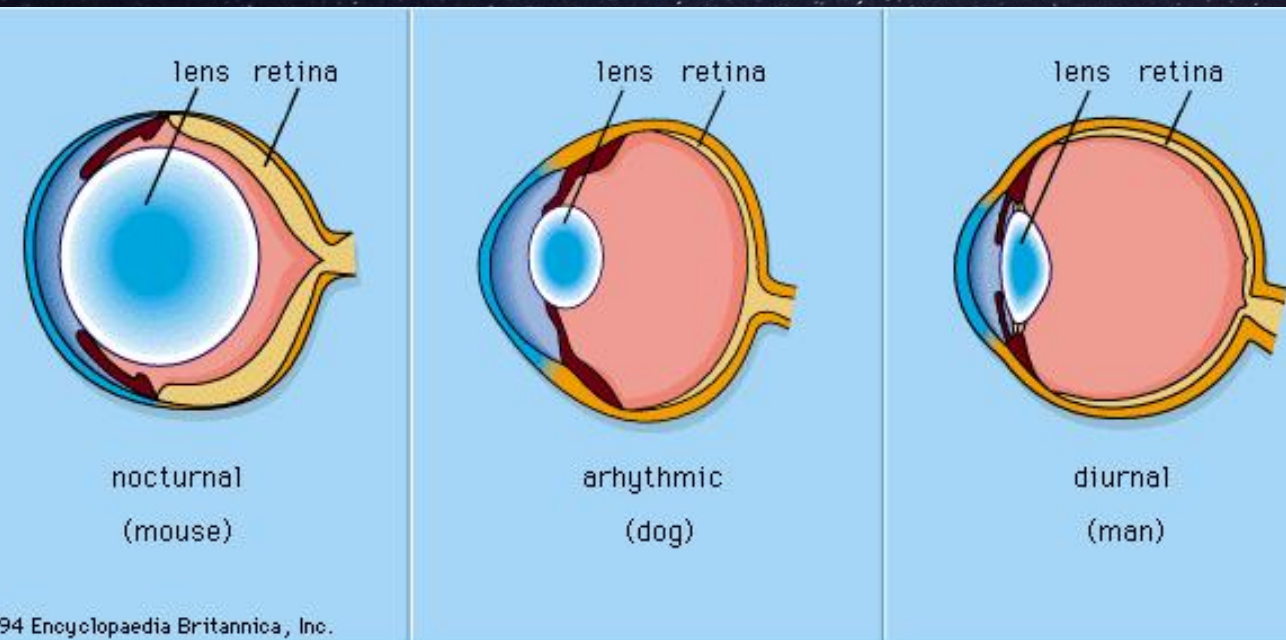
How do animals see at night?

The silk is pushed through a body part called a spinneret and comes out as a thread. Some spiders spin silk webs that look like big white sheets. Some webs look like tiny drops stretched across plants or grass. A spider waits at the center of the web for a tasty insect to land.



How do Beavers build dams?

To make themselves safe from predators, such as foxes, beavers often build a dam that creates a pond or a large lake. These lodges are like little islands that keep the the beaver safe from the outside world.
